# **BODIE A GHOSTLY GOOD ADVENTURE**

Bodie State Historic Park, one of the west's best-preserved ghost towns, is open daily during the summer from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m.View more than 100 remaining buildings preserved in a state of "arrested decay," and imagine what life was like in this gold and silver mining town, which saw a peak population of 8,000 to 10,000. Park admission is \$7. Children 6-16 are \$5, and ages 5 and under are free. Dogs are permitted in the park, but must be on a leash at all times.

Take U.S. 395 north from Mammoth to Hwy 270, seven miles south of Bridgeport. The park is 13 miles from the turnoff and the last three miles are dirt road. Plan travel time accordingly.

Interpretive activities include tours of the Standard Consolidated Stamp Mill at 11 a.m. and 1 p.m., and daily history talks at 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. Tours are free. Dogs are not permitted on the tour.

No smoking permitted. Please leave artifacts — rocks, nails, glass, rusty cans — in place. Info: call 760.647.6445.
