

Goals

1) Develop a plan for an integrated yearround trail network that provides for seamless transition between the Town of Mammoth Lakes, the Mammoth Mountain Ski Area Mountain Bike Park, and the surrounding federal lands overseen by the USFS.

2) Develop a plan that provides guidance for enhancing year-round mobility in a way that is consistent with the Town's "Feet First" strategy.





- Backcountry usage showing a good increase in addition to snowshoe usage up 200%, reflected by our rentals.







Hosts/ Nordic Staff:

- We continue to increase our host and XC staff as the Lakes Basin becomes more populated with multi-users.
- 2016 season- 66.5 hours a week
 - Mon-Thursday 8:15 to 1:00
 - Friday, Saturday and Sunday AM 8:15 to 1:00, Pm shift 12:30 to 5:00 plus a six hour ski host.
- 2015 Season- 42 hours per week
 - Welcome center at spur-staffed 5 days a week.
 - One ski host for six hours on Sat and Sunday
- 2014 Season-24 hours per week
 - Two ski hosts on Sat and Sun for six hours



Spur grooming change:

Problem:

• Groomed trails being walked on resulting in a degradation of the grooming quality.





Spur grooming change:

Reason to cause Change:

• Increased multi-use of the Lakes Basin requires a greater separation and understanding between users.

Change:

• Move the improved trail system up to the junction of Twin Lake Road and Lake Mary Road creating a buffer zone between Nordic skiers and other users.


<u>2016 results:</u>

- At least 1,000 public access people captured in between the spur gate and Twin Lakes Road
- Some lost terrain at Tamarack
- Our season pass holder survey is 3/2 between those who think it helped and those who feel unconvinced by our decision.
- Deterioration of Dome/Vista/Ueli's Alle.

Ideas for further multi-use management:

- Increase hosts for greater information and education.
- Uniform signage
- Enforcement of rules
- Dog clean up stations
- More multi-use trails
- Improved parking and restrooms
- Public transportation incentives by creating, advertising and issuing a token for a discount at Tamarack when you ride the Orange Line.
- Shared financial responsibility for non-fee user management


