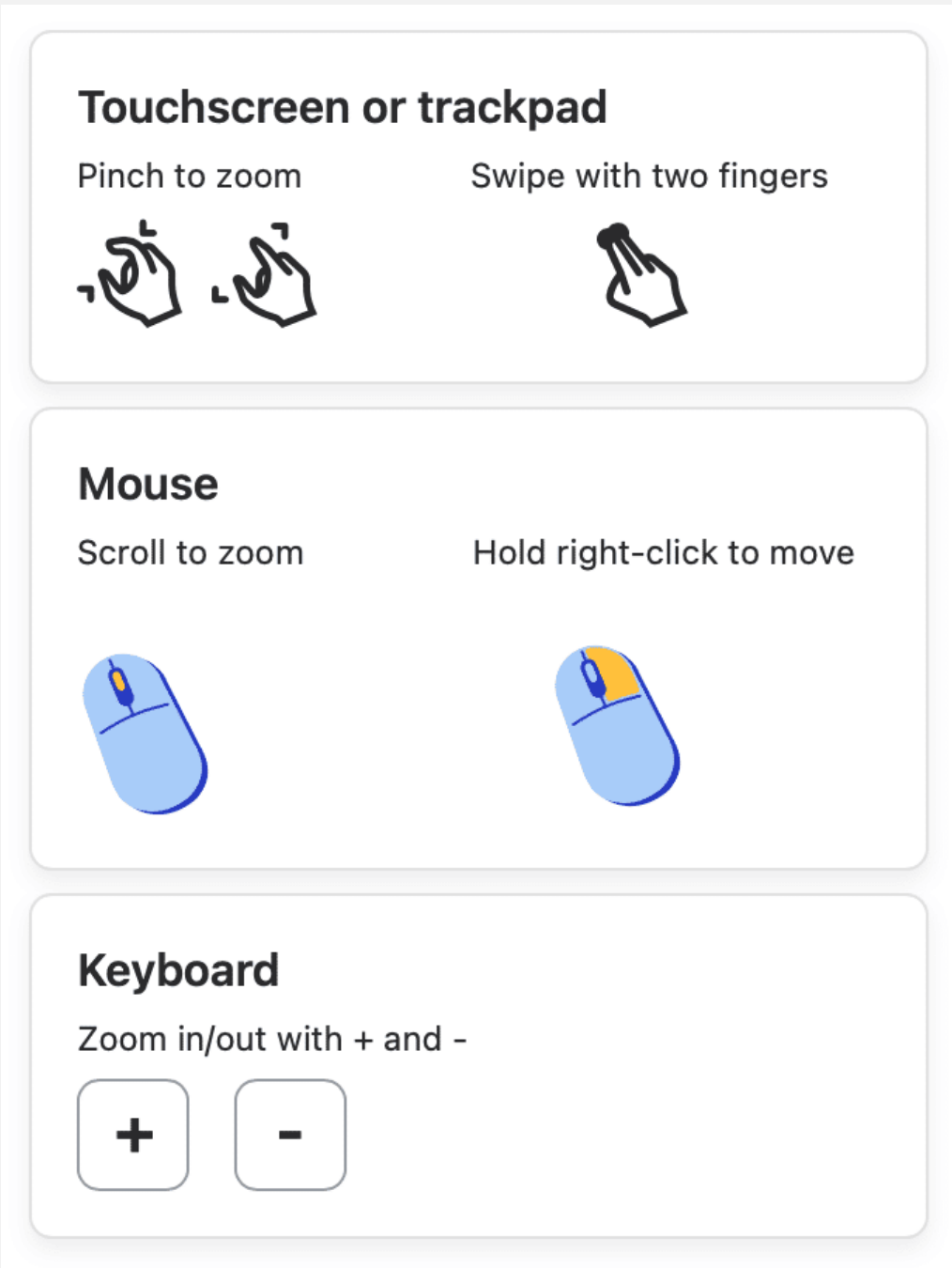

Disparate groups pursuing similar goals in a disorganized or capacity limited manner



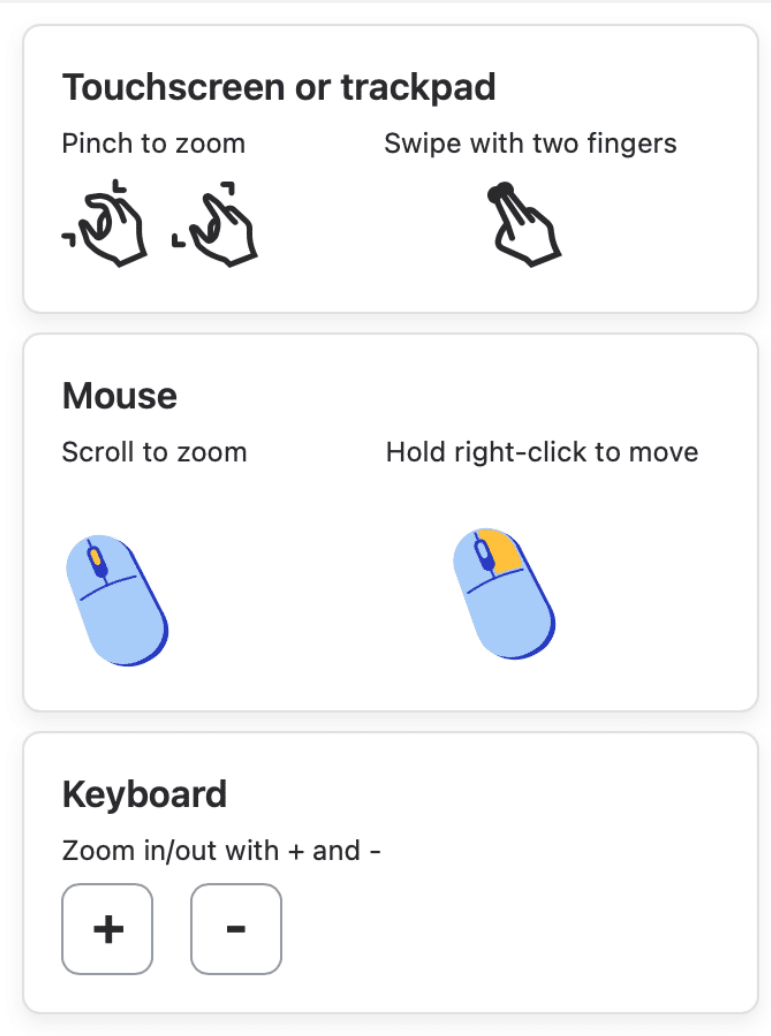

- Partner's changing priorities
 - Government shutdown
 - Contract reporting
 - Cash flow
 - Lack of consistent involvement
