ESSRP VALUES	HOW TO THINK ABOUT OUR REGIONAL ESSRP VALUES AS PROJECT CRITERIA: **PLEASE NOTE: THESE QUESTIONS WERE DRAFTED USING COMMUNITY INPUT ABOUT HOW TO UPHOLD THE ESSRP VALUES. THESE CRITERIA QUESTIONS WILL CONTINUE TO BE REFINED THROUGHOUT COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT PROCESS BASED ON FEEDBACK FROM THE RECREATION STAKEHOLDER MEETINGS. **
Stewardship and Partnership	What kind of education or public stewardship promotion is, or could be, included? Are there potential partners for this project? (For example: consider possible partnership with Tribes, land managers, community organizations, businesses etc.) If so, who?
Diverse Use and Experiences	Is this project targeted for one type of user group? If so, which groups? How can we consider balancing the needs and interests of others, such as: community members, recreation users, stewards, stakeholders, partners, in this project area?
Resource Protection	Does this project: - inspire connection and/or stewardship of the land? - protect resources? Would this project encourage or provide opportunities for community members/tribes/stakeholders/partners to evaluate what resource protection practices are most effective?
Communication Infrastructure	Does this project use communication methods that reflect cultural awareness and sensitivities? (For example: Do signs uses universally understood symbols and/or bilingual?) How would information get communicated back to visitors and community members?

Healthy and Sustainable	What kind of maintenance needs might this project have? Is the cost of this project worth the benefits? What kind of impact might this project have on natural resources? Does it disperse use or concentrate use in one area? Does this project honor Tribes and Tribal relations to the land?
Access For All	How does this project promote: - diversity and inclusion of user and uses? Does this project consider historically marginalized people? If so, how? - stronger community partnerships? - responsible public land use?
