As we prepare to review sustainable recreation project ideas, we would like to start with the acknowledgement that all public lands hold the creation stories, burial grounds, and ceremonies of Indigenous people who were forcibly removed or killed to designate them as such.

The lands that make up the Eastern Sierra are called Payahuunadü or Panawe, and have been, inhabited by the Nüümü (Paiute), Newe (Shoshone), Timbisha, and Washoe peoples throughout the region.


